Combined Council Report:

QCC Meeting – Thursday 26th April
Graeme and Denise attended the QCC meeting along with a letter for the committee to read out in general business regarding the QCC rally. Christine Stevens pointed out that she had a bit of feedback from some members that accommodation was a real problem - members could not book accommodation as it was all booked out due to other events being held on the same weekend.

Val read our letter in the general business part of the meeting and all attending members agreed to push the rally as much as they could at their respective clubs. One member suggested that we put posters in service stations and areas around Caboolture outlining the run. All members agreed that this was a great idea and that they could purchase a lot of these posters and they can be used by any club for big events, particularly the QCC Rally. Service stations are a particularly good place to put the posters as this is where the car traffic is stopping and people will see the posters.

One member suggested that they pay the Secretary of QCC as there is so much work for the secretary to do. This motion was carried at a previous meeting and further discussion will continue at the next meeting. Members agreed that this would be a good idea to attract a new secretary at the AGM

as there is so much work to do. Perhaps a few afternoons a week would suffice.

The president informed members that a bill was passed on 15th March that Clubs that incur less than \$20,000 in assets etc, do not need their books audited. Treasurers should continue to do the books as though they will be audited – have them checked by a non-committee members/s and subsequently filed as such. State Government officials can do spot checks. This was passed in parliament.

Public liability was discussed – do we really need it? Government departments are developing an information package and further information will be forthcoming.

Letter received from a club member asking if a non-club member attends a club run driving another member's car to the run, will he be covered by public liability insurance. Members believed that the person should be covered under the cars registration. Again, prospective club members attending with a view to join should also be covered under their own registration. Council is awaiting information from insurance companies about this and more information will be forthcoming.

Denise advised members that some of our club members are more than happy to billet people for the rally, suggesting that if people want to come in caravans or tents that I am sure we will be able to put them up or stay in peoples homes.

Affiliation fees will remain the same for 2007/08.

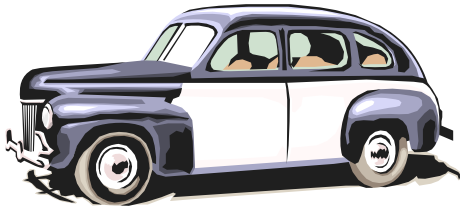

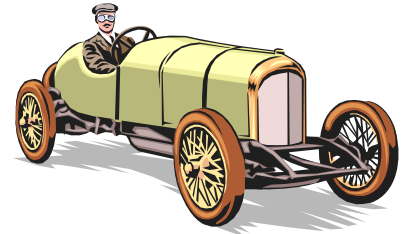
